
Magnificent Places

INTAND NORTHWEST LIVING BY BLACK ROCK DEVELOPMENT






he artist is Eric Hedlund, and his canvas is The Club at Black Rock, an 1,800acre swath of pine-scented wonderland on the shores of Lake Coeur d'Alene just above Rockford Bay. Nearly every structure at Black Rock bears the distinctive imprint of this architecture and interior design visionary—from the property's dramatic 30,000-square-foot golf Clubhouse and new Kootenai Camp to the Member Cabins, Golf Cottages and the collection of contemporary mountain residences known as The Village Homes. As one might have surmised from the sheer magnificence of the Black Rock Clubhouse, Hedlund is no stranger to golf clubhouse design, having created more than 30 himself during his illustrious architectural career as Lead Designer and Vice President at Colorado-based MAI Design Group. In his impressive portfolio are the golf clubhouse designs of The Bridges at Rancho Santa Fe, ProngHorn in Bend, Pine Canyon in Flagstaff, Stock Farm Golf Club outside Missoula as well as Sonoma National and Mayacama, both hailing from California's wine country.

But no matter where you look at Black Rock—whether it's a stunning golf clubhouse or a private lakeview estate—you'll notice it's all defined by the very best in everything. The designs feature the finest building materials and finishes, meticulous attention-to-detail, as well as the time-honored craftsmanship of true artisans whose passion is evident in features such as tongue-in-groove vaulted ceilings and custom wrought iron railings. The homes at Black Rock resonate with the architectural character of the region as well as with each buyer's desire for authentic design and unpretentious luxury. Ample use of native materials inspire many variations of the Black Rock style—an inviting blend of lake home, private lodge and alpine chalet.

The trend of uncompromising quality will continue as Hedlund oversees the creation of Black Rock's second golf clubhouse, an open and uplifting design anchoring the new Tom Weiskopf course. With rich wood, beautiful stonework and intimate gathering areas set before inspiring vistas, the ambiance will be distinctly Pacific Northwest. And all Eric Hedlund. 🕭
